

Dear Applicant to Coastal Academy:

You will need to download the enrollment forms listed below, fill them out completely, and turn them in at your entrance interview. In addition to these forms you must bring each student's <u>Birth Certificate</u> and <u>Immunization Record (or waiver)</u> as well as <u>TB Risk</u> <u>Assessment results for each adult attending Academy Day classes</u>.

- 1. Admission Policy and Liability Forms packet
- 2. Admission Application (1 per student)
- 3. Medical Release (1 per student)
- 4. Verification of Church Attendance (1 per family)
- 5. HSLDA membership proof for 1st 12th graders (go to hslda.org, use group discount #290035)

Download and bring these completed forms if your student is:

6th - 12th Grade Student Code of Conduct

9th - 12th Grade High School Course Description/Grading Standard for each

course, and High School Planning Worksheet

1st - 12th Grade IEP form (if your child is pursuing an Individual Education Plan)

Also needed at the entrance interview are:

- 1. Registration Fee for 1st-12th grade students (\$50/first student, \$30/each additional student)
- 2. First Month's Tuition (Academy Day families \$30/student / Record Keeping families \$30/family)
- 3. Date of Enrollment
- 4. Proof of HSLDA membership
- 5. Report cards/unofficial transcript for high school students

Each family must download and read the <u>Coastal Academy Handbook</u>. In addition, each High School family must download and read the <u>High School Manual</u>.

Parents who will be accompanying their children to our Academy Day program will need to have their **fingerprints** taken and submitted to the Department of Justice one time. The appropriate form and instructions will be given to you at the entrance interview to complete this requirement. Cost is approximately \$75.

Also, please note that the **Parent Teacher Training Attendance Record** must be completed and turned in the last day of the school year.
